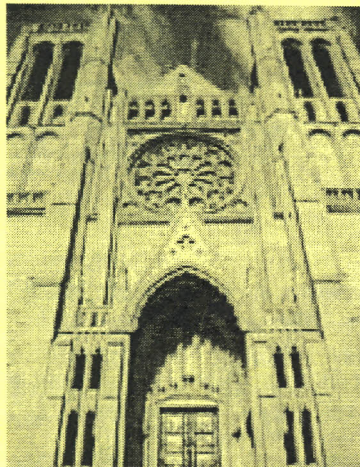

# Jubilate Deo Omnis Terra

## Psalm 100

Flor Peeters (1903-1986)

*Jubilate Deo, omnis terra;  
Servite Domino in laetitia.  
Introite in conspectu ejus in exultatione.  
Scitote quoniam Dominus ipse est Deus;  
Ipse fecit nos, et non ipsi nos;  
Populos ejus, et oves pascuae ejus.

### Ubi Caritas

*Ubi caritas et amor, Deus ibi est.

Et ex corde diligamus nos sincero.*

Where charity and love are, there is God.

And let us love one another with sincere heart.

### Tota pulchra es

*Tota pulchra es, Maria,

Thou art all fair, O Mary,

## About the composers

Flor Peeters , (1903 - 1986) was a Belgian organist and prolific composer of many organ works. He was a Professor of organ at the Royal Conservatory at Ghent, and was considered the foremost organ teacher in Belgium.

Louis Vierne, (1870 - 1937) studied at the Paris Conservatoire under Franck and Widor. After acting as assistant organist to the latter at the church of Saint-Sulpice, he was appointed to Notre-Dame in Paris. The best of his organ works are brilliantly effective and of considerable harmonic originality.

Gioacchino Rossini, Italian opera composer (1792 - 1868) composed the Petite Messe Solennelle near the end of his life in 1864. It is a Mass of solos and choruses, over two hours in total length and full of high musical drama.

Maurice Duruflé only published 14 pieces as a composer, but they are all meticulously written. Born in Rouen in 1903, he studied with Vierne, and won several prizes for his compositions and performance. All of his music is based on Gregorian chant, as he was the director of the Gregorian Institute at the Paris Conservatory. He died in 1986.

Arvo Pärt, an Estonian composer born in 1935, came of age musically in the post WWII decade when high modernism reigned supreme. But in 1968 he suffered a creative block and spent several years in quiet retreat. When he emerged in 1976, his music was unrecognizable. He had invented a style both ancient-sounding and contemporary. The harmonic basis is the triad, with almost no chromatic motion, moving up or down the scale. The music has no traditional tension and release, but rather a centered stillness. His biographer, Paul Hillier, describes it as "a single moment spread out in time."

## Angela Kraft Cross

Angel Kraft Cross, AAGO, organist, pianist and composer, balances her time between being a concert and church musician and being an ophthalmic surgeon at Kaiser Redwood City. She received her undergraduate training at Oberlin and her medical training and Loma Linda University. Angela enjoys an active performing career which in 2005 has taken her to such venues as Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, Washington National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., and Trinity Church in Boston. She is the organist of the Congregational Church of San Mateo.
